1. Avon Hill Cambridge - comfortable middle class housing.
2. Coolidge Hill, Camb - upper middle, well kept, gd for "island" relation to city.
- ✓ 3. Foster St Camb - middle reclaimed house on a tiny intimate scale.
4. Stoughton Rd, Watertown - typical newish but heavily grown middle residential.
5. Whitney Hill, Watertown - sharp & almost new, right behind center.
- ✓ 6. Beacon Hill - very fine, if traditional & special.
7. South End - some of old "parks" still have potential, tho slum condition overrides.
8. Hampshire St - colorful, but again too special.
- ✓ 9. Park Bay - still dignity & space - somewhat special, also fine planned.
10. Harvard St, Central Sq Camb - Lopsided busy if decaying, looking mixed but still some pleasant remains.
- X 11. Beylton St in Dorset area the epitome of the auto

street: gaudy & exploded - & ends in back!

12. Arborway overpass, Forest Hills, exciting visually.

13. Savin Hill - mt. in rel. to surround & to water for view of center. Some unity & self-containment. Pleasant, not bad

✓ 14. Highland Pk, Roxbury - poor houses on commanding ht - quaint tower - all bleak & tall, some character - mixed white & colored - plus nearby Wash. Pk & strange effect of it on West St.

15. Everett Sq - River St Hyde Pk is closer & more intimate than most.

16. Sun. area top Bunker Hill Castles - brick rows & old wd. hses. Dramatic view up Monument St.

✓ 17. Corey Hill, Brookline - best view of city esp. center mixed use ^{& age} paths; pleasant but mis-use hills sloping @ foot - Wash Sq - gd if somewhat spread.

18. Brookline, S. of Baylston @ Reservoir Pk - heavily wooded - small cem.

19. Linear hopping on Harvard St Brookline.

✓ 20. Medford Sq - prosperous center w/ some character

on fine ignored site - surrounded by housing
of wide age & character range & ^{see} institutional
Dove. An mt. area w/ much variety yet
struckly middle.
