General Information This window to be devoted to Christ in Gethsemane, similar
to the one in the south aisle in Christ Church, San Antonio - see color
plate.

The donors "favor the ruby reds and less blue."

Herewith, we are sending the color sketch
for the Berbes window devoted to the theme of
Our Lord in the Garden of Gethsemane. It is
very rough, but you can readily visualize how
beautifully it will work out in the exquisite
detail of line and form to be developed in the
full size drawing and the actual glass.

Christ kneels before the vision of the Cup.
Above is the lantern showing the way to the
Garden. Below is the cock recalling Saint Peter's
denials.

At the base are the nails, and through the
foliated border small crosses at intervals
foreshadow the approaching Crucifixion.

With the donor's preferences in mind, we
have emphasized the ruby reds keeping the blues
to a minimum.
