General Information **Include the Last Supper and Gethsemane, and Arrest of Our Lord by the Soldiers**

We have completed our study of designs for the Dean Matthews memorial window and those in the vestibule, and are sending you the rough color sketches herewith.

As suggested, the Dean Matthews window is devoted to the Last Supper and Gethsemane, *and Arrest*

In the upper medallion ~~Our Lord stands with bread and wine before the Apostles at table, while below He kneels~~ Our Lord kneels in the Garden contemplating the Angel with the Cup. In the diamond shape between is the lantern suggesting Gethsemane at night.

while below the Arrest of Our Lord by the soldiers, with Judas and the young man.

We are enclosing the rough sketch for the new medallion in the Dean Matthews window.

We have represented Judas, the young man and soldiers. We felt it would overcrowd the composition to include the incident of Saint Peter and his sword.

IMPORTANT: Canon Tarbell writes: "I would like to suggest that the cloak of Judas be a little bit more purple, at least the dark part of it, in order to give a little bit more contrast against the blue background."

IMPORTANT NOTE: We have to have the border completely red.
